Quinte SailAbility is a not-for-profit registered Charity which has has been operating for 21 years. The majority of operating costs involves equipment and sail boat repairs, replacement and/or maintenance. In addition, Quinte SailAbility also researches and explores various government funding resources to support eligible expenses.

STAFF

Quinte Sailability hired 3 staff in 2022; Noah Carter, Chief Sailing Instructor, Lauren Molenhuis, Dock Supervisor and Katherine Price-Wessel, Dock Assistant. Staff did an excellent job, and were friendly, professional, hard-working and went above and beyond expectations. Staff worked a total of **702 hours**. In addition to sailing program instruction related activities, staff assisted in fleet repairs, equipment inventory projects and more.

VOLUNTEERS

Volunteers are a vital component to the success of Quinte Sailability, specifically in keeping staff costs down. Volunteers provided over **850 hours** of activity assistance. Activity included season setup, daily dock opening/closing tasks, season teardown, maintenance/repairs, rigging, attending fundraising functions and more. Teenage volunteers are also a valuable part of the program. Volunteering with Quinte Sailability is an excellent opportunity for high-school students to earn volunteer hours, which is mandatory for post-secondary school graduation.
