FINANCIAL

The majority of operating costs involves equipment and vessel repairs, replacement and/or maintenance. Many of the fleet are nearing 20 years old, requiring hull maintenance as well. In 2023, Quinte SailAbility received financial supports from donors, local service clubs, and community funding grant programs. Our goal is to continue maintaining a low membership fee.

As well, in 2023 funding was received through the Canada Summer Jobs Grant Program, as well as the Enabling Accessibility Grant Program. Research into funding resources to support eligible expenses is ongoing. Thank you for supporting Quinte SailAbility!

STAFF

Quinte SailAbility employed 4 staff in 2023; Noah Carter-Chief Sailing Instructor, Ruby Kennedy-Dock Supervisor, Cara Parrault and Austin Gillard - Dock Assistants. Staff did an excellent job, and were friendly, professional, hard-working and went above and beyond expectations. Staff worked a combined **806 hours**. In addition to sailing program instruction related activities, staff assisted in fleet repairs, equipment inventory projects and more.

VOLUNTEERS

Volunteers are a vital component to the success of Quinte SailAbility, specifically in keeping staff costs down. Volunteers provided over **855 hours** of activity assistance. Activity included season setup, daily dock opening/closing tasks, season teardown, maintenance/repairs, rigging, attending fundraising functions and more. Teenage volunteers are also a valuable part of the program. Volunteering with Quinte SailAbility is an excellent opportunity for high-school students to earn volunteer hours, which is mandatory for post-secondary school graduation.
